Required Keys

Major: C G D Minor: a (natural & harmonic forms)

Technique

Scales – Choose a scale format from the following options:

- 1) Tetrascales (two-handed tetrachord pattern) in required keys one octave ascending and descending (*natural and harmonic forms of minor required*)
- 2) One-octave scales (thumb-under pattern) in required keys ascending and descending standard fingerings HS (*natural and harmonic forms of minor required*)

Chords –I and V (i and V – *use harmonic form of minor*) triads in required keys – root position – blocked or broken – HS

Arpeggios – Tonic-chord arpeggios in required keys – root position – hand-over-hand – two octaves – ascending and descending

Chord Progressions – Tonic to Dominant 7th – Major: I $V^6/_5$ I (minor: i $V^6/_5$ i – use harmonic form) in required keys – blocked – HS

Harmonization

Choose one melody to harmonize from **Level Three Melodies for Harmonization and Transposition** RH plays melody and LH harmonizes with one of the following options:

- 1) blocked tonic 5th and blocked dominant 2nd
- 2) blocked I and V6/5 chords

Major: C G D F Minor: a d (natural and harmonic forms)

Technique

Scales – One-octave scales in required keys – ascending and descending – standard fingerings – HS (natural and harmonic forms of minor required)

Chords – I, IV and V (i, iv and V- *use harmonic form of minor*) triads in required keys – root position – blocked or broken – HS

Arpeggios – Tonic-chord arpeggios in required keys – root position – hand-over-hand – two octaves – ascending and descending

Chord Progressions – Tonic to Subdominant to Dominant – Major: I IV $^6/_4$ I V $^6/_5$ I (minor: i iv $^6/_4$ i V $^6/_5$ i – use harmonic form) in required keys – blocked – HS

Harmonization

Choose one melody to harmonize from **Level Four Melodies for Harmonization and Transposition.** The student will play a two-handed accompaniment with blocked or broken chords in the RH and chord roots in the LH while the adjudicator plays the melody (8va).

Transposition

Transpose the prepared harmonization (two-hand accompaniment) to two required keys.

Technique

Scales – One-octave scales in required keys – ascending and descending – standard fingerings – HS (*natural and harmonic forms of minor required*)

Chords – 1) I, IV and V (i, iv and V- *use harmonic form of minor*) triads in required keys – root position – blocked or broken – HS

2) All major and minor triads (white key tonics) – root position – blocked and broken – HT

Arpeggios – Tonic-chord arpeggios in required keys – root position – hand-over-hand – four octaves – ascending and descending

Chord Progression – Tonic to Subdominant and Dominant – Major: I IV ⁶/₄ I V⁶/₅ I (minor: i iv ⁶/₄ i V⁶/₅ i – *use harmonic form*) in required keys – blocked – HS

Harmonization

Choose one melody to harmonize from **Level Five Melodies for Harmonization and Transposition** RH plays melody and LH harmonizes with I IV $^6/_4$ and V $^6/_5$ chords using a blocked, broken, waltz or alberti bass accompaniment pattern

Technique

Scales – 1) One-octave scales in required keys – ascending and descending – standard fingerings – HS (*natural and harmonic forms of minor required*)

2) Chromatic Scale – One octave – Start on C — ascending and descending – standard fingering – HS

Chords – Tonic triads in required keys – root position, 1st inversion and 2nd inversion – standard fingerings – blocked – HS

Arpeggios – One-octave tonic chord arpeggios in required keys – root position – ascending and descending – standard fingerings – HS

Chord Progression – Tonic to Subdominant and Dominant – Major: I $IV^6/_4$ I $V^6/_5$ I (minor: i $iv^6/_4$ i $V^6/_5$ i – use harmonic form) in required keys – blocked – HT

Harmonization

Choose one melody to harmonize from Level Six Melodies for Harmonization and Transposition 1) RH plays melody and LH harmonizes with I, IV $\frac{6}{4}$ and V $\frac{6}{5}$ chords using blocked, broken, alberti bass or use a two-hand accompaniment.

2) In addition, student will sight-read a simple melody and harmonize by ear or by sight with I and $V^6/_5$ chords. No chord notation will be given.

Technique

- Scales 1) One octave HT or two octaves HS in required keys ascending and descending standard fingerings (natural and harmonic forms of minor required
 - 2) Chromatic Scale one octave start on any key ascending and descending standard fingering HS
 - 3) Optional Blues Scale in C, F, G fingering at discretion RH only
- Chords Tonic triads in required keys root position, 1st inversion and 2nd inversion standard fingerings blocked HS
- Arpeggios Two-octave tonic chord arpeggios in required keys root position ascending and descending standard fingerings HS
- Chord Progression Tonic to Subdominant and Dominant Major and harmonic minor in required keys first position (root) and second position (1st inversion) blocked HS or HT

Harmonization

Prepare two items from the following options:

- 1) Play and harmonize <u>by ear</u> a traditional melody (e.g. folk, hymn, holiday melody) using primary chords any style
- 2) Use blues scales for C, F and G to improvise sequential melodic patterns in the RH while LH plays following a 12-Bar Blues chord pattern in block open-fifths

Transpose one of the prepared harmonizations to two required keys.

- Scales 1) One octave HT or two octaves HS in required keys (*minor forms as listed above*) ascending and descending standard fingerings
 - 2) Chromatic Scale Two octaves starting on C ascending and descending standard fingering HS or HT
- Chords All major and minor triads through circle of 5ths beginning with C root position blocked or broken HT
- Arpeggios –Two-octave tonic chord arpeggios in required keys root position ascending and descending standard fingerings HS
- Chord Progression Tonic to Subdominant and Dominant Major and harmonic minor in required keys first position (root) and second position (1st inversion) blocked HT

Harmonization

Choose one melody to harmonize from **Level Eight Melodies for Harmonization and Transposition** RH plays melody with the following:

- 1) LH harmonizes with accompaniment pattern spanning an octave or more using I, IV, V or V7 in root or inverted positions
- 2) In addition, the student should add an introduction or ending to the harmonization

- Chords Play the major, augmented, minor and diminished chord pattern starting on any major triad (white and black tonics) root position blocked HT
- Arpeggios 1) Two-octave tonic chord arpeggios in required keys root position ascending and descending standard fingerings HS

 2) One-octave tonic chord arpeggios in required keys root position and 1st
 - inversion ascending and descending standard fingerings HS
- Chord Progression Tonic to Subdominant and Dominant Major and harmonic minor in required keys first position (root), second position (1st inversion) and third position (2nd inversion) blocked HS *or HT*

Harmonization – Choose one melody to harmonize from **Level Nine Melodies for Harmonization and Transposition** with the following:

- 1) RH or LH plays melody and the opposite hand harmonizes with the I, IV, V and V7 chords. Accompaniments may include blocked, broken, waltz, alberti, two-hand, open-style spanning an octave or more and rolled chords.
- 2) Student must incorporate two or more different accompaniment styles.
- 3) Include an introduction and an ending.

 - 2) One-octave tonic chord arpeggios in required keys root position, 1st and 2nd inversions ascending and descending standard fingerings HS

Chord Progression – Tonic to Subdominant and Dominant – Major and harmonic minor in required keys – first position (root), second position (1st inversion) and third position (2nd inversion) – blocked – HT

Harmonization

Choose one melody to harmonize from **Level Ten Melodies for Harmonization and Transposition** with the following:

- 1) RH or LH plays melody and the opposite hand harmonizes with I, IV, V and V7 chords. Accompaniments may include: blocked and broken chords, waltz bass, alberti bass, openstyle spanning an octave or more, rolled chords, LH moving in single-notes, and two-hand chordal accompaniments
- 2) Student should use chord inversions as indicated.
- 3) Student must incorporate two or more different accompaniment styles.
- 4) Student must include an introduction and an ending.
- 5) Optional: Shift melody and accompaniment from hand to hand.
- 6) Optional: Include multiple-voice harmonization of melody in RH with chosen accompaniment style in the LH.

Major – C G D A E B F Bb Eb Ab Db Gb Minor – a e b d g c f (natural, harmonic and melodic forms) Minor – f# c# (natural and harmonic forms)

Technique

- Scales 1) Two-octave scales in C, G, D, A, E major and c, g, d, a, e minor ascending and descending standard fingerings (natural, harmonic and melodic forms of minor as listed above) HT
 - 2) Two-octave scales in F, Bb, Eb, Ab, Db, Gb, B Major and b, f, f# and c# minor ascending and descending standard fingerings (natural, harmonic and melodic forms as listed above) HS or HT
 - 3) Chromatic Scale Two octaves starting on any key ascending and descending standard fingering HT

Chords -

- 1) Chords Play triads of the major and minor keys in C, G, D, A, E Major and c, g, d, a, e minor (*harmonic form*) keys followed by the Dom7 of each key root position blocked HS or HT
- 2) Play the Dom7 (V7) chords with inversions in C, G, D, A, E Major and c, g, d, a, e minor (harmonic form) blocked HS
- 3) Build all standard qualities of 7th chords (Maj7 = MM; Dom7 = Mm; min7 = mm; half-dim7 = dm; dim7 = dd) root position on any white key blocked or broken HS or HT

Arpeggios – 1) Two-octave tonic chord arpeggios in C, G, D, A, E Major and c, g, d, a, e minor – root position – ascending and descending – standard fingerings – HT

- 2) Two-octave tonic chord arpeggios in F, Bb, Eb, Ab, Db, Gb, B Major and b, f, f# and c# minor root position ascending and descending –standard fingerings HS or HT
- Chord Progressions 1) Tonic to Subdominant, Supertonic and Dominant in C, G, D, A, E Major and c, g, d, a, e minor (harmonic form) keys first position (root), blocked HT
 - 2) Tonic to Submediant, Subdominant and Dominant in C, G, D, A, E Major and c, g, d, a, e minor (harmonic form) keys first position (root), blocked HT

Level 11 cont.

Harmonization

Choose two melodies to harmonize from **Level Eleven Melodies for Harmonization and Transposition** with the following:

- A. Choose one melody from Melodies #1-5
 - 7) RH plays melody and the LH harmonizes with I, ii, IV, V7 and vi chords *Note: Chord inversions should be observed as indicated.*
 - 8) Accompaniment should include simple blocked or broken chords.
 - 9) Optional: Additional accompaniment patterns from Level 10 may be used.
 - 10) Transpose this item (Item A) to two required keys.
- B. Choose one melody from Melodies #6-7
 - 1) RH plays melody and the LH harmonizes with 7th chords.
 - 2) Accompaniment should include simple blocked or rolled chords.
 - 3) Optional: Additional accompaniment patterns from Level 10 may be used. *Note: For each 7th chord in the accompaniment, all four of the 7th chord tones should be represented in the accompaniment to maintain the 7th chord quality.*
 - 4) No transposition is required for this item (Item B).
